

CONVERSATION HOSTS

Lily Seto and Leanne Lowish

Lily Seto and Leanne Lowish will be hosting this emergent conversation. The topic of 'wisdom of non-duality' arose as they were sensing into what is emerging in the world and how that impacts the coaching profession. What are we as coaching supervisors bringing forth in ourselves to meet what is being asked for by the coaching community - how can we bring greater presence, wisdom, clarity, and creativity to hold space for the emerging possibility.

Both Lily and Leanne are students of non-dual wisdom teachings.

Lily has been a student of non-duality since she started to feel the world breaking open a number of years ago and was searching for meaning. Her influencers are Thomas Hübl, Alan Seale, John Prendergast, Fiona Adamson, Robin Shohet and Joan Wilmot. Lily has been facilitating global coaching supervision groups both internally and externally, for over 10 years. With her individual supervision clients, there is often an invitation to move into the transpersonal work and the holding of non-duality.

Leanne has been a member of the Diamond Approach (a mystic school) for 20 years. She first experienced the non-dual in her mid 20s and has practiced with many different teachers across the world. A long time meditator, she is currently studying with Thomas Hübl, Rev. angel Kyodo williams, Patricia Albere and the Evolutionary Collective. She trained as a psychospiritual psychotherapist at Psychosynthesis Institute and the Centre for Transpersonal Psychology in London. Leanne runs CSA Diploma in Americas, APAC and Japan and sees the essence of her work as captured by Ram Dass 'we are all just walking each other home'.

Seeing the Whole. Systemic Coaching & Super-vision

Workshop Presenter: John Whittington

SESSION DESCRIPTION

The 'super-vision' that visual mapping and constellations offer is a potent and useful approach to coaching and supervision. The map of the unconscious field that the process illuminates is in service of one thing 'Wholeness'. This focus on the coherence of the system is non-duality in practical action. John will demonstrate this in his session through an introduction to the stance, principles and practices of this 'applied philosophy.'

To introduce the stance, principles and practices of systemic coaching and supervision. John will facilitate a short taster of a two day in-person training he will deliver on Vancouver Island, Canada in September 2025.

SESSION DESCRIPTION

How do we get over ourselves and let the Field do its work? In this session, we will imagine a Bigger Self, a Bigger Purpose and the necessary shift from 'I' to 'we'. We will explore lineage which goes beyond family and location. And we will use the processes of Emergent Dialogue to practice 'an unfolding process of creative participation between peers' (D Bohm). Come prepared to 'let go, to let come', to play with reconnecting with your Self and how to trust the Field to find its way in your work with supervisees. We will use reflective processes, visualisation, sharing in breakouts and video. Do join me.

Edna Murdoch

Prior to training and working in coaching, Edna was an educator, stress management consultant, Psychotherapist and Clinical Supervisor. Following a 1-year training in psychodynamic supervision, she trained for 2 years in Creative Supervision at the Centre for Transpersonal Psychology, London. With colleagues, she established the Coaching Supervision Academy in 2001 and since then, has trained many coach supervisors in their programmes all over the world. SESSION DESCRIPTION

We live in a world full of duality tendencies and characterized by opposing forces or dualities. These dualities can be seen in various aspects of life, such as good and evil, light and dark, joy and sorrow, and so on. It suggests that these opposing forces are interconnected and necessary for balance and growth.

This engaging, interactive and transformative workshop experience will explore the profound concept of nonduality, rooted in Earth wisdom, and its potential application in coaching supervision. It will provide practical strategies and support for integrating nonduality into participants' coaching and coaching supervision practices.

This workshop is designed for coaches and coaching supervisors, both experienced and novice, who are interested in deepening their practice and broadening their perspectives through the wisdom of nonduality.

Dr. Okokon O. Udo, PhD, PCC, CMC

Dr. Okokon Udo is the Program Director of the Evidence Based Coaching program at Fielding Graduate University and the founder and CEO of SoulEngineering LLC. He is committed to creating the right conditions for leaders to discover or rediscover their true selves and bring that to bear in their work; delivering value for themselves and their organizations. Okokon is an international change management, leadership and Diversity, Equity & Inclusion consultant.

He has served on the faculty of Northwestern Health Sciences University, assistant professor in Master's in Organizational Leadership program at St. Mary's University, the Executive Coaching Program of the University of St. Thomas and the Co-Active Training Institute. Okokon is a Certified Professional Co-Active Coach (CPCC), a Professional Certified Coach (PCC) from the International Coach Federation (ICF), holds a diploma in Reflective Supervisor and a Spiritual Director. Okokon holds a PhD in Pastoral Care and Counselling from Luther Seminary, and MA in Process Oriented Psychology (focused on conflict facilitation and organization change).



The Use of Inquiry in Nondual Wisdom Traditions, Coaching, and Supervision

Workshop Presenter: Dr. Damian Goldvarg

SESSION DESCRIPTION

According to Prendergast, "Nondual wisdom refers to the understanding and direct experience of a fundamental consciousness that underlies the apparent distinction between the perceiver and perceived. Nondual wisdom expresses itself as and through radiant heart (love) and illuminated mind (wisdom)". Awakening nondual awareness and cultivating an experience of the unconditioned mind adds a depth dimension to our work as coaches and supervisors. In this session we will explore how to develop nondual awareness, how to overcome obstacles (such as attachment to suffering) and implement practices to use inquiry in our work with supervisees and clients. Some of these practices include: pure listening and speaking, systematic contemplation, radical questioning, critical deconstruction, and dancing in the paradoxes of nondual logic. Participants will engage in two exercises to practice ideas presented in the session.

Dr. Damian Goldvarg, MCC, ESIA

Damian Goldvarg has thirty years of experience in executive assessment and coaching, leadership development, talent management, facilitation, and team coaching services. Originally from Argentina, he has worked with individuals and organizations in over sixty countries. He is a Master Certified Coach (MCC) and received his Ph.D. in Organizational Psychology from Alliant University in California. He is also a Professional Certified Speaker (CSP), an Accredited Coach Supervisor (ESIA), and Accredited Team Coach (ACTC). He facilitates certifications on Professional Coaching, Team Coaching, and Coaching Supervision. He was the 2013-2014 International Coaching Federation Global President and received the 2018 ICF Circle of Distinction Award for his contribution to professional coaching worldwide.

Begin Again Mind and the Practice of Not Knowing in Supervision

Workshop Presenter: Claire (Genkai) Breeze

SESSION DESCRIPTION

Non duality is a natural state of awareness and receptivity available to us all. Extending our receptivity and learning to trust emergence can be a challenge to our planning, value adding, professional identity. This session will help you to reclaim your own sense of what working in a space of wholeness feels like and the impact that it can have on your work with your clients and yourself. We will experience just how creative and surprising this way of working can be. A mix of stories, ideas, practices and conversation all held with a light humour and the knowledge that you cannot get this wrong!

Claire (Genkai) Breeze

One of the first executive coaches in the UK. Claire Genkai was the founding partner of Relume Ltd, and author of two books on Challenger leadership and the mindsets and practices associated with a strong challenge to habitual thinking. A practicing Zen Buddhist and a Practitioner of Supervision. She works with coaches, change agents, leaders and those who are facing the end of their lives. She believes the Supervision conversation IS the conversation of our age.



The Single Eye

Workshop Presenter: Amaranatho Robey

SESSION DESCRIPTION

The widely used seven eye approach to coaching super-vision suggests the different lens to co-explore within supervision. From a non-dual vision, there is only one eye, recognizing and trusting this allows things to be the way they are. Embracing this singular perspective allows for acceptance and trust in the way things are, promoting freedom and ease in being oneself, in relationships with supervisees, and in the broader world.

During this interactive workshop, participants will engage in pair and small group experiments, which I often refer to as "play." The aim is to help participants recognize the non-dual perspective, fostering a sense of unity and acceptance. Additionally, the workshop will provide dedicated reflection time to delve into the practical implications of this approach to coaching supervision.

Amaranatho Robey

Amaranatho is an accredited coaching supervisor with the EMCC and a leadership coach. He brings his experience of being a Buddhist monk for 15 years to those wanting to recognise who they really are. He offers non-dual coaching supervision to retreat leaders, facilitators, and coaches. Specializing in spiritual bypassing and unresolved trauma, his expertise spans retreats and workshops. He developed the PlayfulMonk approach to support executives and teams to stay calm and connected in complex situations. As part-time Head of Faculty and Leadership at Blend Associates, he empowers healthcare executives to navigate demanding environments with resilience and insight.

As Coach Supervisor we are invited to be with all that is to illuminate individual patterns, systemic landscapes and the force field of ideas, thoughts, and feelings that lock potential.

Tapping into the Soul's Light Map will unveil opportunities for learning, gateways of truth and alternative paths forward. By experiencing the subtleties of resonance and dissonance, this session invites intuitive expansion and creative expression in a way that can be translated to your coaching supervision sessions.

Experience the frequency and vibration of self and other to identify practical ways of sharing information from the field in our coaching supervision sessions. Exercises will focus on how we see, hear, feel, and sense energetic data and then how we translate this awareness to our clients without attachment.
